Jammu Police registered 200 FIRs under NDPS Act in 2024

Jammu Police undertook extensive operations throughout 2024, to combat the growing menace of drugs and to prevent narco-crimes in the district.

As part of its anti-drug drive, the spokesman on Sunday said that police registered 200 cases under Drugs the Narcotic and



Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and arrested 300 individuals

involved in drug peddling.

As many as 83 vehicles involved in these cases were also seized during this period.

As many as 153 FIRs were registered in heroin recovery cases alone and 246 individuals were arrested.

mental health has been rising. She further said that the unscientific belief and stigma associated with mental illnesses are a matter of past, making it easier for those suffering from various ailments to seek help.

This has been a welcome development, especially at this juncture, because a variety of mental health issues are taking epidemic proportions around the world. The COVID 19 pandemic in particular led to a spike in such concerns," Murmu pointed out.

According to the President, working professionals face more stress, and a large number of the elderly people suffer from loneliness due to social challenges.

"Women bearing the burden of domestic responsibilities and care giving for the family are prone to a range of mental illnesses that usually go unnoticed. However, it is truly heartening to note that the rising awareness has made it possible for patients to open up and share their problems," she said.

Stating that many organisations have started putting mechanisms in place to respond to such issues, Murmu lauded initiatives of NIMHANS like Tele-MANAS (Tele Mental Health Assistance and Networking Across States) which facilitates counseling anywhere at anytime.

She also appreciated the Institute's SAMVAD platform which addresses child and adults and mental health problems. The President also stressed upon the healthy marriage, saying it is the foundation of a healthy society.

Expressing her happiness about the gender ratio at NIMHANS, she highlighted that 79.7 per cent of the undergraduate students and 61.4 per cent of post graduate students are women.

"I believe that women can add a unique perspective in mental health care, in care giving, as well as in research," she said.

"We aspire to establish a Centre of Excellence in Precision Medicine with Next-Generation Sequencing (NGS) technology, serving as a referral hub for Northern India," he said and added that AIIMS Jammu is also enhancing the residential complex with thoughtful additions such as a cycle track, soft music, and a crèche.

"As we continue our journey toward becoming a 'Global Village,' AIIMS Jammu is poised to welcome international students and establish a Counseling and Study Centre. In Inpatient and Emergency care, AIIMS Jammu has already managed 679 patients in 100 operational beds, and we are set to expand to 250 beds within a month and 750 beds within six months, he said adding that the Trauma and Emergency Department has efficiently managed 3,135 cases, with 289 ICU admissions and 54 dialysis sessions performed to date.

"Surgical services have also shown remarkable progress at initiation, with 281 successful surgeries performed across multiple specialties since the launch of OT services on September 17, 2024," he added.

The state-of-the-art diagnostics at AIIMS Jammu, including 3 Tesla MRI, 128-slice CT, and advanced screening technologies, have supported over 3,409 USG scans, 554 MRI scans, 896 CT scans, and 5,926 X-rays, ensuring that our patients receive timely and accurate diagnoses, said the CEO.

"In 2025, we aim to further enhance innovation and collaborative research in actual patient care settings to set new benchmarks in healthcare excellence," said Dr Gupta.

The Assistant Drug Controller reported that they have conducted 104 inspections, suspending 02 licenses in this month and 19 samples were also lifted and sent for analysis to ascertain the quality parameters in the current month. It was also shared that the district achieved a 100% target in the installation of CCTV cameras, and efforts are underway to achieve a 100% target in CBS. The meeting was attended by ADC ACR, CMO, DSP- hq, Tehsildars and other NCORD Committee members.

DC reviews implementation of Swachh Bharat Mission in Kishtwar

Deputy Commissioner (DC) Rajesh Kumar Shavan on Wednesday conducted a comprehensive review of the Swachh Bharat Mission (SBM) implementation in the district while chairing a multi department meeting. The Chief Executive Officer Kishtwar Development Authority, ACD and Executive Engineer PWD were directed to install male and female toilets, benches, and a kiosk near the FCI Store in Kuleed under the Town Beautification initiative.

Additionally, the DC discussed the action plan for maintaining clean, hygienic and plastic-free conditions in townships and rural areas. He directed the EO Municipality, NHID-CL, GREF, and Rural Development

Department to carry out the immediate desilting of drains in the town and surrounding areas, stressing the need for a modular and proactive approach while encouraging full community cooperation in rural areas. The ACD and Municipality authorities were instructed to submit a list of both functional and nonfunctional toilets along with a list of Non-Functioning street lights both in the towns and rural areas.

NHIDCL was directed to inspect the working of streetlights from Hasti to Malipeth and repair any non-functional units. Furthermore, they were instructed to construct drains from Thathri to Sinthan Top to prevent water stagnation on roads, while GREF was instructed to construct drains from Kuleed to Sansari Nallah.

The DC also emphasized the aesthetic beautification of public spaces and key crossings across the district, such as Hidyal Chowk, Viewpoint Malipeth and Bindraban. The meeting decided to create Selfie points at these sites. A committee headed by ACR and comprising GREF officials was formed to oversee removal of encroachments obstructing drainage from Kuleed Chowk to 5RR. To enforce SBM guidelines, the DC set a target of achieving 100% whitewashing in the district. He also called for imposing fine on shops, establishments and dhabas that fail to whitewash their shutters. NHIDCL and GREF were directed to ensure uniform drain lengths and to repair potholes after completing drain cleaning in a time bound manner. The discussion also included operation of community toilets in the town, removal of illegal and outdated hoardings, and overall sanitation improvements. Purity Under Threat

ecently, there has been news that fake ghee was being prepared in Agra in the name of 18 famous and big companies. The prepared ghee was supplied to many states including UP. Fast food is prepared in the market with this ghee. Earlier also, fake ghee has been caught from time to time. There are complaints of cheese, milk, mawa and other food items being fake in the market. Flour, pulses and other food items have also been caught of poor quality. For some time now, there have been complaints of spitting in food or water, urinating, washing food utensils in drain water. In such a situation, the question arises that what should a person eat outside the house now? What should a person do to fill his stomach while travelling? Do we have to go back to the old situation, when a person used to carry food from home. When the food at home was finished, he used to manage by eating fruits, but did not eat from the market. Or will he now have to carry readymade food packets of big companies from home?Fake Desi Ghee was being prepared in the plot of the newly developed colony on Maruti City Road in Tajganj, Agra and supplied throughout the state. Police and SOG team raided and seized fake Desi Ghee packed in the name of 18 famous brands including Amul, Madhusudan, Patanjali. It was being adulterated with refined oil and other chemicals. Five people including the factory manager have been arrested.DCP City Suraj Kumar Rai said that the factory was being run by putting a tin shed in the plot of a person named Rajesh Agarwal in Maruti Prabhasam Colony on Maruti City Road. The plot was taken on rent. During interrogation, it was told that Brijesh Agarwal, Pankaj Agarwal, Neeraj Agarwal, residents of Gwalior, have a brand of Desi Ghee named Pure It. They opened the factory about six months ago. Rajesh Bhardwaj of the colony was made the manager. The ghee was packed in tins and boxes by pasting stickers of the brand which was in demand in the market. The press was also told that a large quantity of ghee, raw material, stickers of many companies, machines used, packing machines etc. have been recovered from the factory. The value of the recovered goods is being said to be in crores. Police is registering a case against the factory operator and employees on its own. FSDA team has also been called for action. The accused are being questioned.Police said that a consignment of 50 tins of fake Desi Ghee was sent to Meerut shortly before the raid. Efforts are being made to recover this material. Police said that fake Desi Ghee was being supplied in the state as well as in the surrounding states.It was being prepared from palm oil, refined, vegetable oil and essence. The fragrance was like real ghee and the grains were also grainy, for a moment even the police team got the illusion of real ghee. DCP City Suraj Kumar Rai said that he himself reached the spot. The first question asked was how the ghee was made. The accused said that people do not recognize Desi Ghee. Some look at the fragrance and some look at the grains. They used to prepare Desi Ghee by mixing palm oil, refined, vegetable ghee, chemicals. They used to add essence to it. So that it smells. Expired date refined ghee was also found from the spot. Police asked the accused why they bought it. The workers told that expired goods are available at cheaper rates. When they used to make Desi Ghee, they used this refined oil as well. According to Agra Police, investigation of the bills revealed that fake Desi Ghee was sold directly in fast food markets of more than two dozen cities of Uttar Pradesh besides Rajasthan, Haryana, Punjab, Assam and Bihar. Dosa, Bhalle, Samosa and Omelette were made from this ghee. According to Food and Drugs Department Gwalior, Ramnath Agarwal and his family members were earlier involved in the fake ghee business and were also booked under NSA. They had left Gwalior since 2010.Earlier on 24 November 2023, Delhi Police has busted a factory in Dwarka, where adulterated ghee was made and it was sold in containers with stickers of brands like Patanjali, Mother Dairy and Amul. The sample of Baba Ramdev's renowned company Patanjali brand cow ghee was collected by the Food Safety and Drugs Department from a shop in Ghansali of Tehri district on the occasion of Diwali in the year 2021. ------

ENJOY THE FROTH TILL IT LASTS

IN OTHER WORDS, WITH HUGE UNCERTAINTY IN THE GEOPOLITICAL SITUATION, FINANCIAL MARKETS HAVE BECOME SPECULATIVE, AS INVESTORS SEEK HIGHER RISK, SHORT-TERM RETURNS, EVEN AS THE FED HAS CUT INTEREST RATES FOUR TIMES SINCE SEPTEMBER BUT HINTED AT ONLY LIMITED CUTS NEXT YEAR.

Whighly unpredictable Donald Trump as US President this month, how should anyone manage his or her risks? We define risk as the possibility of the occurrence of an event or condition which, if it occurs, would negatively impact our well-being. We scan risks in order to try to avoid or mitigate such risks.

Those who have wealth care the most because they have the most assets to lose. The first thing to remember is risk cannot be eliminated, only managed or hedged. In a static zero-sum system, one man's risk is another man's opportunity. You squeeze one side of a balloon, it will expand on other sides. However, the balloon may burst or leak, so such risks are not improbable. In a dynamic environment, the balloon is ever expanding, and any action by one party could affect not only other parties, but also the balloon (system as a whole) itself. There are always costs to hedging risks, and if you choose the wrong hedge, you could lose even more when an unexpected event occurs.

The World Economic Forum's Global Risk Report 2024 (published last January), based on a global risk perception survey of 1,500 experts, was remarkably comprehensive in laying out the fears of a rapidly accelerating technologically changing world beset by climate warming and conflict. In the short-term (two years), the top risks ranked by severity were misinformation and disinformation, extreme weather events, societal polarization, cyber security and inter-state armed conflict. Over a ten-year horizon, top risks include extreme weather events, critical change in Earth systems, biodiversity loss and ecosystem collapse, natural resource shortage and misinformation and disinformation.

Surprisingly, involuntary migration, interstate armed conflict and geoeconomic confrontation were ranked 7th,15th, and 16th respectively over the next ten years, whereas at the end of 2024, migration, nuclear war risks and tariff confrontation all surfaced as headline concerns affecting elections and geopolitical tensions. As polarization occurs, misinformation and disinformation by warring factions caused a huge loss of trust in governance, resulting in populist and "strong men" leaders who promised to stabilize life for the confused electorate. Trump is promising to end the Ukraine war and seeks to have transactional deals, using the threats of tariffs on allies and enemies alike. Even as the fate of Ukraine and Gaza/Syria depends on the outcome of who is really winning the armed conflict, with Europe being the biggest eco-

nomic victim in terms of growth, the big picture depends on whether Trump can stabilize the US-China geopolitical rivalry.

The United States leads in GDP at market currencies at US\$29.2 trillion against China's \$18.3 trillion, together accounting for 43.2 per cent of the 2024 global GDP of \$110 trillion. In purchasing power parity (PPP) terms, however, China leads with \$37.1 trillion, whilst US has \$29.2 trillion, both accounting for 37.3 per cent of world GDP of \$185.7 trillion. India is ranked 3rd at \$16 trillion and Russia at \$6.9 trillion, whereas in market currency terms, India and Russia are ranked 5th and 11th respectively. With technological, military, economic and financial dominance, the United States still has a deciding edge in terms of power say, even as China has emerged as the leading manufacturing and trade power. As Trump has clearly recognized, American power rests on the mighty dollar, a position that the United States must defend.

The irony is that the more the dollar is weaponized, the more its global users feel uncomfortable for fear of sanctions, freezing, confiscation or medium-term devaluation. The recent CF40-Peterson Institute of International Economics conference showed how rational, scholarly and professional economists are trying to figure out ways to manage trade and tariff tensions on both sides, even as political rhetoric is reaching alarming levels. One of the most respected China economists, Professor Huang Yiping, explored potential outcomes, from fighting a full-blow trade war, China buying more from the US, voluntary export restraints, to decoupling in selected sectors and RMB appreciation (Plaza Accord II). The Peterson trade economists are predicting that tariffs will cost the United States in terms of higher manufacturing and import costs, with impact on inflation. If a fullblown trade war occurs, the world could be sent into a protectionist

recession. If you want to be scared by nuclear war, read the just published US Defense Department's China Military Power Report 2024. How are financial markets reading and hedging these global risks? The US stock market is at all-time highs, with the NASDAQ index up 29.1 per cent year to date (YTD), whilst the Dow Jones Index is up 15.3 per cent. Bitcoin is up 137.9 per cent YTD, whereas gold surged over 28 per cent.

In other words, with huge uncertainty in the geopolitical situation, financial markets have become speculative, as investors seek higher risk, short-term returns, even as the Fed has cut interest rates four times since September but hinted at only limited cuts next year. Since the Fed has begun cutting interest rates, the S&P US Bank index has delivered returns of 35.67 per cent YTD. Singapore bank stocks are up over 40 per cent YTD, with dividend yields of around 5 per cent per annum. So, risk-adverse investors holding bank stocks have been rewarded iust as much as those holding frothy tech stocks. In sum, the global risk picture looks fraught with shocking events and dramatic turns almost daily. Trump 2.0 will add to the bumps. And yet, the largest economy in the world is still printing money to finance its

trade and fiscal deficits.

Thus, in dollar terms, investors are stuck between greed and fear. As long as the Fed has to cut interest rates to reduce the US fiscal burden, global investors will continue to bet on the financial sector leverage play. Will it all come to grief? The American economist Herb Stein said, "If something cannot go on forever, it will stop." But the music will not stop because reserve currency central banks can go on printing money to finance unsustainable fiscal deficits. So, enjoy the frothy music while it lasts.

Omar prioritizing concerns of a terrorist's son rather than a terrorist's victim is highly condemnable: Pawan Sharma the kashmir talk bureau

DC Kupwara emphasizes on upscaling therapeutic management, proper counseling of drug addicts

THE KASHMIR TALK BUREAU KUPWARA:

To review the progress made to curb drug abuse in Kupwara district, a meeting of District Level Committee of Narco Coordination (NCORD) was held today under the chairmanship of the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Kupwara, Ayushi Sudan at meeting hall of DC Office Complex, here.

At the outset, the Deputy Commissioner took a detailed appraisal from concerned members of NCORD Committee regarding the present scenario of drug related occurrences, various issues related to menace of drug addiction, its control and rehabilitation and areas of concern.

The DC meticulously reviewed the implementation of the measures taken and progress achieved to eliminate drug abuse and its peddling in Kupwara District. She took feedback from the members of the Committee who presented the latest report related to action taken against drug-addiction and drug trafficking in the District. On the occasion, the DC stressed upon the Officers of all the line Departments to further intensify IEC activities, connecting communities including religious influencers and civil society members. The DC also emphasized the Officers including Enforcement agencies for identification and close vigil of entry points, hot spots of drugs, public places and abandoned buildings.



Similarly, the DC also laid thrust on further intensifying IEC campaigns (seminars, rallies and other programmes on the harmful effects of drug menace) at Schools and Colleges levels to sensitize students and common masses about illeffects of drugs and close coordination between Health , Education and other line departments. She also reviewed the functioning of Drug De-addiction Centre Kupwara and Addiction Treatment Facility Centre (ATFC) Handwara and stressed for upscale the therapeutic management and proper counseling of the drug addicts which can help the addicts to come out of the menace. The DC said in order to combat this rising societal problem, multi-pronged Rehabilitation, Counseling and Guidance policy is indispensable to be implemented on ground to monitor drug abuse and take remedial measures to curb the menace so that sufferings of the drug- affected persons is mitigated.

The Police department was directed to share details of attached properties of drug peddlers with concerned Tehsildars who will mark red entries of these properties which cannot be sold.

The Medical Superintendent District Hospital Handwara was directed to conduct counselling sessions for families of drug abusers so that they may live a respectful life. Patrolling of police parties around the abandoned buildings shall also be intensified, besides, SHOs and Tehsildars shall conduct joint visits to these places to put strict vigil on drug abusers.

On the occasion CMO Kupwara Dr. Ramzan appraised the chair that 1221 cases of drug and substance abuse have been identified in the district, 703 are undergoing treatment, 388 cases fully recovered till date. It was given out that cent percent CCTV cameras have been installed in the medical stores of the district. Chair was apprised that as many as 69 FIRs were registered in police district Kupwara 105 drug peddlers were arrested. In Police District Handwara 30 FIRs were registered and 62 drug peddlers were arrested and lodged in different jails. The meeting among others was attended by ADC Mohammed Rouf Kupwara, Rehman, ACP Kupwara, ASP Kupwara, CMO, CEO, Medical Superintendent DH Handwara, Assistant Drug controller Tehsildars, besides other concerned Officers.

Jammu Police's remarkable achievements **Rally Held For Safety** in the war against drugs in 2024

THE KASHMIR TALK BUREAU JAMMU:

To facilitate treatment of Drug addicts, largest "Police Drug DEaddiction, Rehabilitation, Mental Health Care Centre" Channi, Jammu made functional since March-2024"

In a determined effort to combat the growing menace of drugs, the Jammu Police undertook extensive operations throughout 2024, achieving significant success in their mission to curb narco-crimes in the district.

As part of its anti-drug drive, the police registered 200 cases under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and arrested 300 individuals involved in drug peddling.83 vehicles involved in these cases were also seized. It is pertinent to mention here that 153 FIR's were registered in heroin (Chitta) cases alone and 246 individuals arrested in these cases.

Among those arrested, 19 hardcore drug peddlers were booked under the stringent PIT NDPS Act, reflecting the department's zero-tolerance approach toward habitual offenders.

In a remarkable move to dismantle the economic foundations of drug trafficking, the Jammu Police attached 11 Immovable properties (residential/commercial), worth Rs.4,69,91,369/- and 03 Movable Properties (Vehicles), worth Rs 12,50,000/- in the district under the NDPS Act were seized during the year-2024. The confiscation of these illegally acquired assets represents a critical step in disrupting the financial networks of drug syndicates.

04 Drug hotspots were demolished during 2024 and Jammu Police is working seriously on all fronts to demolish the remaining drug hotspots with the active support of civil administration and General Public.

The police also recovered contraband and psychotropic substances including 43.854 Kgs heroin valued several hundred crores in the black market. This recovery underscores the magnitude of the narcotics trade in the region and the police's relentless efforts to intercept and eradicate the supply chain.

Recognizing the importance of public awareness in the fight against drug abuse, the Jammu Police conducted 19 Drug awareness programs, 52 PCPG meetings, 47 Thana Diwas and 62 Debates across the district in 2024. These initiatives aimed to educate the public, especially the youth, about the dangers of drug abuse and to promote a drug-free society. The campaigns were well-received and have played a crucial role in fostering community support for anti-drug initiatives.

The Jammu Police's efforts in 2024 mark a significant stride in the ongoing battle against drugs. By combining enforcement with awareness, they have set a robust precedent for tackling the drug menace and safeguarding the future of the community. Jammu Police is working intensively to uproot the chains of drug supply in the region and fully committed for rehabilitation of drug addicts.To facilitate the Drug DEaddiction/Rehabilitation of Drug addicts, J&K Police during 2024 made functional one of the largest and well equipped "Police Drug DEaddiction, Rehabilitation and Mental Health Care Centre Channi, Jammu.". It is pertinent to mention here that Police Drug Deaddiction Centre was made functional by at DPL Jammu in 2013 and this year in the month of March ,it was shifted to newly constructed building equipped with all the latest facilities for treatment of drug addicts at Channi, Jammu. Since 2013 till 31.12.2024,16645 drug consumers/addicts visited OPD of Police Drug DE-addiction Centre Jammu for treatment and while as number of IPD patients/drug addicts is 1915 during the same period. In the year 2024 only,1486 patients/drug addicts visited OPD of Police Drug DE-addiction Centre and IPD number during the same period was 287.J&K police is making serious efforts to further upgrade the DE-addiction facilities for victims of drug menace.

Mass RTI Filing Sparks Hope and Resistance in Mallabuchan Village

More than 50 RTI Applications filed on spot

In a historic demonstration of collective action, residents of Mallabuchan village, supported by activists from the J&K RTI Foundation, filed mass RTI applications today, marking a significant step in their fight for safe drinking water and accountability. Over 50 RTI applications were filed on the spot, with more to be filed later due to the unexpectedly large turnout.

"We weren't expecting such a huge gathering," said Ishfaq Majeed, Membership Secretary of the J&K RTI Foundation. "While 50 applications were filed today, more will follow to ensure every household's voice is heard." The village, located at the intersection of Budgam and Baramulla districts, has suffered from a lack of safe drinking water for over two decades. While a few houseclean water, the majority of the village remains without this basic necessity. Despite repeated appeals, the authorities have failed to address the issue, and recently, an official escalated tensions by filing a police complaint against villagers, accusing them of raising baseless concerns.

"This is not just about water; it is about dignity and justice," said Er. Irfan Ali Banka, Chairman of the J&K RTI Foundation.

"The police complaint was an attempt to silence the villagers. Through RTI, we aim to restore their dignity and demand accountability from the authorities."

Prominent RTI activists, including Sajad (RTI Secretary, J&K RTI Foundation), Syed Farhat (Senior RTI Activist), Ishfaq Majeed (Membership Secretary, J&K RTI Foundation), and Momin Hussain Banka (Member, J&K RTI Foundation), were present at the event, guiding and supporting their applications. The RTI applications filed by each household address critical issues, including: The lack of consultation with Gram Sabhas and Panchayat Samitis in planning water supply schemes. The exclusion of women from decision-making processes, violating the 73rd Constitutional Amendment.

The discrepancy between official records and the actual water supply situation. The lack of transparency in forming Pani Samitis and drafting the Village Action Plan.

Questions about the allocation and utilization of funds for water supply projects in the area.

Women played a central role in the event, stepping forward to file RTI applications and demand accountability for the first time. "We didn't know we had the right to be involved in these decisions," said one participant. "Today, we are demanding what is rightfully ours - safe water and respect for our voices."

The J&K RTI Foundation has also helped establish the "Action 4 Mallabuchan" group, a local initiative aimed at sustaining this momentum and ensuring ongoing pressure on the authorities to act.

RTI activists believe this campaign will expose administrative neglect and force the government to respond. Parallels were drawn to a similar effort in 2014, when RTI activists in Sonawari, Bandipora, organized mass RTI filings after devastating

The accused were immediately taken into custody, and a case was registered under FIR No. 02/2025, U/S 8/21/22/25/29 NDPS Act at Police Station Bishnah. This operation underscores the commitment of Jammu Police to eradicating the menace of drug trafficking and ensuring the safety and well-being of the local community.
