J&K police busts inter-state narco-terror smuggling syndicate, 4 held

KUPWARA: Jammu and Kashmir police on Saturday busted an interstate narco-terror smuggling syndicate originating from Pakistan-occupied

Kashmir and recovered eight kilograms of heroin along with the arrest of four smugglers, read a statement from Kupwara Police.

The accused have been identified as Yousuf Bokra, a resident of Rashanpora Kralpora, Showkat Ahmad Khatana, a resident of Meliyal Kupwara, Maroof Ahmad Mir, a resident of Jumagad in Kupwara and Laba Masih, a resident of Awaan Ramdas Ajnala, Punjab. As the Karnataka Pradesh Congress Committee (KPCC) office swung into celebrations after the party's resounding victory in the Assembly polls, top Congress leaders including AICC president Mallikarjun Kharge, state party chief DK Shivakumar, and former CM Siddaramaiah displayed a show of strength during a press conference there. Will it be Siddaramaiah or DK Shivakumar? All eyes are now on who the Congress will pick as the next chief minister.

Meanwhile, a row erupted at the counting centre in Jayanagar - the only seat yet to have its results declared - after BJP's R Ashok and Tejasvi Surya were seen inside the centre. According to Election Commission website, the Congress is leading in Jayanagar.

Dal Lake Cleaning On In Double Shifts For G20 Meeting In Srinagar

SRINAGAR: Authorities in Srinagar have pulled out all stops to clean up the city and the famous Dal Lake ahead of the G20 working group meeting later this month with 500 labourers working under "mission mode" to beautify the urban water body.

The tourism group meeting of the G20 is scheduled to be held at Sher-i-Kashmir International Conference Centre (SKICC) on the banks of Dal Lake here from May 22

In the run-up to the event, the cleaning drive at the lake is in full swing.

Lake Conservation and Management Authority (LCMA) – which is responsible to keep the water bodies, including the Dal Lake, clean has deployed men and machinery for the cleaning process.

The authority is using both mechanical and manual means to clean the lake and make it beautiful for the guests.

"The main function is happening around the Dal Lake, and so, the drive to make it beautiful and attractive is on," vice chairman of LCMA, Bashir Ahmad Bhat said

Bhat said for the beautification process, the authority is using mechanised interventions, including machines, harvesters, etc, and the work has been taken up in double

"We are working in double shifts. The labour force is cleaning the shorelines.

The drive has been taken up under a mission mode, not just for the G20 event, but for the forthcoming tourist season as well.

We will keep the lake clean and I am hopeful that our guests will be happy to see the lake," he said.

The vice chairman, LCMA, said around 400-500 labourers were working every day to clean the lake.

"We have nine harvesters, 8-10 weed grabbers have also been deployed, they are working in double shifts.

There is dredging going on near the shorelines as well," he added.

Bhat said many aerators were used, adding that lighting systems have also been installed to give the lake a special look for the G20 event.

Apart from the cleaning process, a thick layer of security has been thrown around the lake to secure the meeting venue, and Marine and NSG commandos will also be deployed as an extra security measure.

At a security review meeting here last week. Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) Kashmir zone Vijay Kumar emphasised the importance of river and lake domination in ensuring the security of the G20 summit, a police handout said.

Kumar also emphasised the need for the Marine Commandos (MARCOS) to be deployed to provide a strong security cover for the water bodies around the summit venues, it added.

"The ADGP Kashmir shared with all stakeholders that NSG teams will be used for counter fidayeen attack along with SOG and specialise NSG teams to counter drones will be deployed at all venues," the police said.

FADA complaints against sales of 2-wheelers by 'unauthorized' multi-brand outlets

JAMMU

The Federation of Automobile Dealers Associations (FADA), in collaboration with the Delhi & Mumbai State **Transport** Department, has expressed concerns the illegal practices of unauthorized multibrand outlets (MBOs) selling twowheelers.

FADA has reported that these MBOs are acquiring unregistered vehicles in bulk from dealers and reselling them to customers at discounted rates, higher than the prices offered by original equipment manufacturers (OEMs) through authorized dealers, without any commitment to aftersales service. This has not only impacted the legitimate dealerships but has also shaken customers' confidence in the brand and dealer partners. Furthermore, these MBOs indulge in evasion of GST, income tax, issuance of fake/ undervalued insurance policies, delivery of vehicles without registration/ HSRP and helmets, resulting in revenue loss on various fronts.

FADA has reached out to Shri Eknath Honorable Shinde, Chief Minister, Government of Maharashtra, Mr. Vinod Aggarwal, SIAM President, the and Transport Commissioners Mumbai and Delhi, urging them to take stringent action against these MBOs and ensure their compliance with industry standards and regulations.

Chief Minister of Maharashtra and T r a n s p o r t Commissioners of Mumbai and Delhi have initiated action against this illegal practice. The Delhi transport department is also taking stringent action against the outlets operating such illegal trade practices.

The authorities had already issued notice on Trade Certificate cancellation to such business units.

Commenting on the stringent actions being taken by the transport

department, Mr Kailash Gahlot, Transport & Environment Minister of Delhi said "Delhi govt will not tolerate any such illegal activity or corruption. We are committed to take action against any such instance".

Mr. Ashish Kundra, Principal Secretary cum Transport Commissioner, Transport Department of NCT Delhi, acknowledged FADA's contribution and said, "FADA has been working closely with the Dealer fraternity and the government to maintain a healthy and lawful business environment in the region. A legal notice has been issued to all the involved parties, and their respective trade certificates have been put under the scanner."

Manish Mr. Raj Singhania, President of FADA said, "We have raised the issue of unauthorized multi-brand outlets (MBOs) in the 2wheeler industry, which are not certified as bona fide dealers and sell unregistered vehicles without any trade certificates or after-sales services. This has caused many legitimate two-wheeler dealerships to shut down, making their businesses unviable. Such activities not only tarnish the image of dealerships but also harm brand image and values.

The dealership business is dynamic and contributes consistently to the economic development of the nation, generating significant employment opportunities in the sector. Illegal practices such as this cause massive losses to the government and society and lead to significant loss of motivation among dealers, leading to greater loss of employment opportunities."

FADA has urged all dealerships remain vigilant and report any instances of unauthorized purchases or sales to the appropriate authorities. 

Army to have common uniform for all officers at

Brigadier and above ranks from August 1

JAMMU: In a major development, the Indian Army has decided to have a common uniform for all the officers at Brigadier and above ranks, aimed at promoting and strengthening a common identity and approach in service matters among the senior leadership.

It would come into effect from August 1. It must be noted that the officers at Brigadier level and above ranks, including Major General, Lt General and General do not have regimentation boundaries. Sources in the Indian Army said that the step would further reinforce the force's character to be a fair and equitable organisation

They also added that the decision was taken after detailed deliberations during the recently concluded Army Commanders Conference in April this year with extensive consultations with all stakeholders.

How would the uniform be?

The headgear, shoulder rank badges, gorget patches, belts and shoes of senior officers of flag rank (Brigadier and above) will now be standardised and common. The flag-rank officers will now not wear any lanyards. The sources also added that there is no change to the uniform worn by Colonels and belowrank officers. It is pertinent to mention here that in the Indian Army, Brigadier and above officers are those who have already commanded units, and battalions and are mostly posted at headquarters and establishments where officers from all arms and services work and function together. "A standard uniform will ensure a common identity for all senior-rank officers while reflecting the true ethos of the Indian Army," sources said.
